PRESERVATION SPOTLIGHT

East 4th Street National Historic District Project Launched

The City of Reno partnered with Kautz Environmental Consultants to begin the first phase of designating East 4th Street as a National Historic District. This project documented the history and architecture of the area, covering East 4th Street from Evans Avenue to Galletti Way, with fieldwork conducted in Spring 2024. The official nomination for the historic district is expected to follow in 2025 or later.

• Why East 4th Street?

East 4th Street played a crucial role in Reno's transportation history, evolving from a railroad hub in the 1800s to a key route for the automobile industry by the 20th century. As part of the transcontinental Lincoln Highway and U.S. Highway 40, it contributed significantly to Reno's growth in commerce, transportation, and tourism.

• Information Sessions Held

Kautz Environmental Consultants held sessions to present their findings, discuss significant buildings, and explain the benefits of historic designation. This initiative aimed to preserve and share East 4th Street's unique history with the community. 

NPF'S LEGACY: PAST PROJECTS

NPF played a crucial role in expanding the historic designation of Paradise Palms, Clark County's first master-planned community. Originally designated in 2017 with 216 mid-century homes, the historic overlay has now grown to include nearly 1,000 homes, making it the largest single-family historic neighborhood in Southern Nevada. This expansion ensures the preservation of the community's architectural heritage and highlights its significance in Las Vegas history. Paradise Palms is celebrated for its unique desert modern architecture, designed by notable architects like

Hugh Taylor, William M. Bray, Dan Palmer, and William Krisel. NPF, as the custodian of the Hugh Taylor archive, preserves 5,000 architectural drawings of Taylor's residential and commercial projects, including landmarks like the Moulin Rouge renovation, Sunrise Hospital, and the Showboat Bowling Alley. This project reflects NPF's ongoing commitment to protecting Nevada's cultural and architectural legacy, ensuring that the history of Paradise Palms continues to be recognized for generations to come.
