NPF'S LEGACY: PAST PROJECTS

Nevada Preservation Foundation has worked on preservation projects throughout Nevada, including a historic hotel and casino in Elko County. **The El Rancho Hotel and Casino** has been a significant community space for Wells since its construction in 1949. Originally a hotel and casino, the El Rancho became a central venue for community events, hosting quinceañeras, parties, and serving as a popular restaurant. Damaged by a 6.0-magnitude earthquake in 2008, this historic midcentury building was



revitalized with support from NPF, city funding, and grants. Restoration efforts included reclaiming original bricks and nominating the property for the National Register of Historic

Places. Celebrating its 75th anniversary in 2023, the El Rancho remained a resilient landmark in downtown Wells.
